
"Random Word" Project

Ms. T. was assigned a project when she was in school, where she had to draw random words out of a hat, and create 2 pieces of art based on those words. She got the words *illuminated*, *ignited*, *tree*, *shadow*, *unicycle*, *chained*, *ladder*, and *mask*. This made her think of a circus, so this is what she came up with:





<u>Directions</u>: Since we don't have a hat to pass around, Ms. T. found a "random word generator" for you to use online. I would change the category to "medium". Then click on "new word", and write down the first 5 words that it generates (if you come across a word you don't know, you can click it one more time). You will then create a 30-minute drawing that makes the 5 words go together, like Ms. T.'s circus drawing. You will do this every day this school week, take a picture of *all 4 drawings* (we didn't have "school" Monday because of Memorial Day), and send them all in one email or Remind101 message to Ms. T. on Friday. Don't forget to tell Ms. T. what your words were for your projects! ©

<u>Credit/No Credit</u>: Remember, we would usually be in art class for 5 hours in a "normal" school week. Right now, teachers are asking that you work for half of that amount of time; 2.5 hours a week. In order to give you credit for quarter 4, I am looking for some *effort*. In order to make sure you are putting in enough effort, and will get credit for your projects, I would recommend *setting a timer* for 30 minutes when you are working on your daily drawings.

<u>Materials</u>: Since everyone's situation at home is different, you can use whatever art materials that are available to you. Ms. T. used watercolor pencils in hers, but you can use pen, paint, colored pencils, make a magazine collage, or use a combination of materials, etc.
